1. Closing date for school entries is Saturday June 8th 2024.

2. Entrants must be in Year 3 to Year 7 on the closing date.

3. Each child can enter only one poem. It must be their own original work. Maximum 30 poems per school. Where the same title is used, please distinguish between them: eg 'Hope 1', 'Hope 2', 'Home 1', 'Home 2' etc.

3. Each poem should be on a separate piece of A4. No pupil/school names on front.

4. School stamp and clearly written full name of child on back of each poem sheet (if entries sent by post) or on the form if emailed. Please complete school entry form clearly so all names, year groups, poem titles and school contact details are clearly legible.

5. One completed entry form per school with details of all the poems submitted.

6. Poems must be typed or handwritten in black ink.

7. Teachers/parents/carers of young poets should state clearly on the entry form, as to whether their candidate/child is challenged by a relevant specific educational need.

8. Young poets can enter poems already written this school year at home or school or write new poems on any theme. Entries must not have been previously published, broadcast or have won another competition (unless in an individual's school magazine). UK entrants only.

9. Teachers: If sending entries by post, please send one set of originals with names on reverse and one set of photocopied entry forms and photocopied poems (with no names) for the judging stage.
