

The 9th Chiswick Book Festival brings together top authors and their readers for an inspiring and entertaining long weekend of fiction, history, politics, memoir, crime, gardening, music, food, wine, the environment, workshops, children's books & more.

Since 2009, the Chiswick Book Festival has raised more than £60,000 for charities which support reading and literacy and for St Michael & All Angels Church, which hosts the Festival. This year the Festival will continue to support:
