**TICKET PRICES** Ticket prices are shown individually against each event. On a trial basis, after a review and extensive feedback, most events will be individually priced - as at other book festivals - and the Day Pass will only be available on Sunday. We know many people have appreciated the flexibility and value of the Day Pass on both days, but we hope the change will please those who want to be certain they can

get into their chosen events. We shall be seeking further audience feedback after the Festival. The price for the Sunday Day Pass is £20 and excludes workshops and Cookbook Festival events (unless otherwise stated).

**Please note:** Admission to Day Pass events is subject to venue capacity. Please arrive early to avoid disappointment.

#### BUYING BOOKS

A team from Waterstones' Chiswick branch will sell copies of the authors' books after each event and most authors will stay to sign books.

#### VENUES, TRAVEL & TIMINGS

On Friday, Saturday and Sunday, all events take place within 5 minutes' walk of Turnham Green tube station: at **St Michael & All Angels Church, Parish Hall & Marquee, Arts Educational Schools** (ArtsEd), **the Tabard pub** and **the Tabard Theatre** (all in Bath Road); **London Buddhist Vihara** (Dharmapala Building, The Avenue) and **Ginger Whisk** (14 Turnham Green Terrace Mews). Other sessions take place at **Chiswick House & Gardens** (Burlington Lane), **Chiswick Library** (1 Duke's Avenue), **Fuller's Brewery** (Chiswick Lane South, by the river) and **Waterstone's** (220 Chiswick High Road).

#### DISABLED ACCESS

The Burlington Pavilion at Chiswick House, St Michael & All Angels Church and Parish Hall, ArtsEd, Chiswick Library and London Buddhist Vihara have full disabled access. However, The Tabard Theatre and Fuller's Hock Cellar are accessed by staircases and unfortunately do not have a lift.

#### FOOD AND DRINK






